



SCURS

by Jacqueline Greenwell

Recently a problem arose in our herd of White Galloways. It was scurs.

While trying to resolve this issue, I contacted many longtime and current breeders. What I found was that, while a few select breeders knew what I was talking about, hardly anybody knew exactly what was involved genetically and how this had crept into our herd. Because this is a real issue in certain bloodlines, and because many breeders don't know what to look for, I wanted to write this article to help educate others.

First of all, because many don't even know what scurs are and what they look like, I will try to describe it to the best of my ability. Scurs are small horn-like growths on the frontal bone in the same location horns would grow. Scurs are referred to as "wiggle horns" in German and indeed, most

are moveable and are not attached firmly to the skull. Scurs typically do not appear until about 4 months of age and stop growing at a few inches if left on. Some scurs will never grow much bigger than a thumbnail. Because we have cattle that have wonderfully long hair, scurs can hide under the shaggy hair of the poll. Because of this it is good to periodically check the poll area when doing other annual herd work.

Genetically, scurs are a little tricky. Because animals who have scurs are still considered "polled" genetically, there is no DNA test yet developed to test specific animals as carriers of the gene. However, through the process of elimination, if scurs are in your herd, you can figure out which cows and/or bulls are carriers and should therefore be culled from the purebred, registered herd.

For male animals to physically show scurs, they only need to have one copy of the gene,





Why are scurs a problem? If the animals are still considered "polled" it's not a big deal, right? Wrong! The AGBA herd book rules clearly state:

"Regardless of their color patterns, the following cattle are not eligible for registration in any Section or either Appendix of the Herd Book:


... (iii) Any animal with horns or scurs. Scurs are defined as any cartilaginous or horn-like growth which may develop through the skin, or on the skin, at the horn site."

As we continue to develop our herds, and as we market them, making them more appealing to the everyday cattleman, we need to remember to choose replacement females and bulls, looking for not just one or two characteristics, but by looking at the entire animal, not sacrificing breed standard for an attribute we have been breeding for, for some time possibly.








A class of bull calves during the 2009 NILE Galloway show.



from either the sire or dam. These animals should not be saved for breeding. Therefore, all males that carry the scur gene will have visible scurs.

Heifers and cows, to physically show scurs, must have two copies of the scur gene, therefore, both of her parents, sire and dam, are carriers of the scur gene. This females calves will ALL be carriers of the scur gene and her bull calves will all have visible scurs and heifer calves will be carriers. Therefore, this particular animal can pass on the gene to any of her calves. Her calves will have a 50% chance of being "clean", neither showing scurs or carrying the gene, while the other 50% of her calves may or may not show scurs but will still carry the gene. However, a heifer carrying only one copy of the scur gene, from either parent, will not have visible scurs.


